The following programs have been identified as best-fit programs for **Forest Environmental Resources** students; however, students are welcome to participate in other programs.

AUSTRALIA | University of Wollongong

Wollongong offers a variety of courses applicable to a Forestry major and a scenic campus close to pristine beaches. It has a diverse student population and is a top research institution in Australia.

DENMARK | University of Copenhagen

The university is the oldest in Denmark and offers many advantageous opportunities to fulfill credit requirements and gain a cultural experience.

EQUADOR/GALAPAGOS | Universidad San Francisco de Quito

The university offers numerous courses in environmental science and an excursion to the tropical forests of the Oriente is only a few hours from campus.

GHANA | University of Ghana

The University of Ghana has a large selection of GEP and science courses. The campus is located only 8 miles from the capital of Accra and offers a unique educational and global experience.

JAPAN | Nagoya University

Nagoya University offers a wide range of courses as well as a valuable experience that is only available for a full academic year.

NEW ZEALAND | Massey University

Massey University offers students the widest range of courses and the opportunity to choose from three campuses in Auckland, Palmserston North, or Wellington. It is New Zealand's largest educational and research institution with a tradition of academic excellence across disciplines.

SOUTH AFRICA | University of Cape Town

FEATURED SHORT TERM PROGRAMS

AUSTRALIA / NEW ZEALAND | **Sustaining Culture & Environment (Summer)** Discover natural history of parks, beaches & fjords with a focus on natural resources, protected areas, and sustainability. Reflect on challenges of protecting and conserving fragile environments while sustaining human societies. *Program alternates locations each year.*

BAHAMAS | **Biological Sciences on Andres Island (Summer)** Explore the biodiversity of the Bahamas while learning the science and policy of conservation biology through research. **Credit:** BIO 495 & FW 495.

COSTA RICA | **Natural Resources of Costa Rica (Spring Break)** Experience tropical rainforests and cloud forests. Discuss natural resource conservation with scientists, naturalists, and the leadership of the Technological University of Costa Rica. **Credit:** NR 491

NAMIBIA | **Ecology & Conservation (Summer)** Study wildlife management with field biologists amongst the desert landscape Participate in field excursions and discussions with conservationists. **Credit:** 4 credits for FW465.

NICARAGUA | **Tropical Wildlife (Spring Break)** Visit coffee plantations, nature serves, and the permanent bird banding station while being immersed in Nicaraguan historical cultural and language. *This program runs every other year on even years.* **Credit:** FW 405/595.

SWEDEN / CANADA | **Sustainable Use of Natural Resources (Summer)** This Forestry program will focus on a wide range of topics such as timber management, energy, municipal waste management and much more. *Program alternates locations each year.* **Credit:** NR 350.
